Men' Shed Health and Safety

Men's Health:

Seniors Week, celebrated from August 18 to 26, is the perfect time to bust some of the myths around aged care assessment. The Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT) is a highly skilled group of registered nurses, occupational therapist, physiotherapist, psychologist, social workers and indigenous health workers. The aim of aged care services is to ensure older persons and their carers have access to a range of health care services appropriate to

Clinical Nurse Lenore Young is on the Gladstone team. She said ACAT assessments were done at home or in hospital to determine what services could be put in place to support the person to stay at home or to access residential care in a facility. "An ACAT assessment and approval is required if you wish to access residential aged care, that is either for respite or permanent, or a community package of care in your home," Ms Young said. Referrals may come from the family, the hospital, your GP or a friend, with the client's consent. The Gladstone Men's Shed Brain Storming Session went well with a definite outcome and generalised plan so we can move forward. The Council has drawn up a peppercorn lease for our three blocks in Moura Crescent. We will send the documents to get checked over by our shed solicitor. Once he considers they are ready to be signed Mark R. and Ron R. will sign and return to the Gladstone Regional Council. Then we can begin the process of researching relative financial costs etc. associated with the preparation of the allotments. The committee asked Col to check what costs would be involved should we want to amalgamate the three blocks. Col also mentioned that lodgement fees would have to be paid upfront but some of this expense would be refunded as we are a not for profit unit.

Tom suggested that seeing as it would be some time before we actually moved in to the Moura Crescent area we could possibly start a community garden on one of the blocks so that the residents would see that we were creating a presence in the area and it would involve community participation.

A small engineering workshop in Gladstone requires regular cleaning. It needs the Swarf cleared from the mills and lathes, the floor swept and then washed and it needs a general tidy up. This needs to happen

It used to take the person who did the work about 3 hours to do, however it hasn't been done for a while and I know it will take some doing to get it back up to standard, but long term it is likely to be about 3 hours per week.
